Actions Taken: WUFBON has implemented several key interventions:

• Increased Awareness: Significant rise in community awareness about gender justice issues.

- 2. Educational Programs: Conducted workshops and training sessions to raise awareness about gender-based violence and harmful practices.
- 3. Community Mobilization: Engaged religious leaders and community members in advocacy campaigns.
- 4. Men-Fathers Month: Celebrated the gazetted Fathers Month as a district-led initiative to highlight the role of men in ending gender-based violence, addressing insecurities, teenage pregnancies, and advancing climate change solutions using the Population, Health, Environment, and Development (PHED) approach.
- 5. Mapping of Cultural Resources: Published a report on mapping cultural re sources for the advancement of women, which is widely used by partners to promote women's inclusion.

- Empowerment: Empowered over 1,000 women and girls through educational and support programs.
- Policy Influence: Successfully influenced local policies to better protect women's rights.
- Community Reach: Reached over 110,000 individuals through various programs and initiatives such as radio talk shows, district interfaith hubs engagements, sports and music shows, brass band outreaches, churches, mosques, and community meetings (source: fbonetwork.org). Challenges Faced:
- Cultural Resistance: Overcoming deep-rooted cultural norms that perpetuate gender inequality.
- Suicide among Queer women and Youth: Emerging mental health challenges due to discrimination and stigmatization of Queer people.
- Resource Constraints: Limited funding and resources to expand our programs.

6. Support for Queer Women and Women with Disabilities: Implemented activities to support and uplift women with disabilities, albino women, and queer women, ensuring they have access to religious leaders for their spiritual needs.

7. Women of Faith Movement: Established a movement to unite women of faith in advocating for gender justice and social change.

8. Forum for Women District Councilors: Formed a forum bringing together district councilors to advance gender equality and advocate for women's budgets indistrict councils.

Lessons Learned:

- Community Engagement: The importance of involving com munity leaders in advocacy efforts.
- Sustainable Practices: Developing sustainable models for long-term impact.

- Program Expansion: Extend our educational and advocacy programs to more regions.
